
Thinking Map



Personal Response

Vocabulary

generation: a group of people born or living during the same time. Page 1, first section. Sentence: I was born in the generation that was still in elementary school when the first Harry Potter book was published.

poverty: the state of being poor or not having money. Page 1, second section. Sentence: Other authors who are now famous like J.K. Rowling also overcame poverty and worrying about making money with their writing, such as Stephen King whose books used to get rejected over and over before finally becoming popular and making lots of money.

queue: to stand in line waiting for something. Page 1, second section. Sentence: The excited fans queued in a line that stretched around the block in order to attend the first showing of the movie they had been waiting for all summer.

exhibition: an event in which something of importance is shown off. Page 1, section 3. Sentence: The museum held an exhibition of antique, famous books, and the event was attended by people from all over the world.

edition: a version of a published text. Page 2, section 1. Sentence: First editions are versions of books that were printed the first time a book was published, so books that become popular and are reprinted many times later have very valuable first editions.

manuscripts: the original copy of a book or other text before it has been printed. Page 2, section 2. Sentence: The old manuscript dates back to the 1800s and is brittle and faded, unlike the crisp, fresh copies of the book you can buy at a bookstore.

philanthropist: someone who is dedicated to giving money and supporting charities. Page 2, section 2. The millionaire who made her fortune creating a popular phone app regularly donates money to and publicly supports the Make a Wish Foundation.

Objective Summary

The seven book Harry Potter series is celebrating its twentieth anniversary. There was a special symbolic hashtag to commemorate the anniversary. In England, numerous celebrations focus on crafts, quizzes and music. The series influenced an entire generation. The books were a positive influence on a generation of young people who were experiencing difficulty in their lives. The novels have become part of a special exhibit at the National Library in Scotland. J.K. Rowling sold over 450 million books. These books have influenced the publishing industry by earning \$825 million. This franchise has taken J. K. Rowling from poverty to philanthropy.
